Data Science & Business Analytics	GitHub / Personal Site	Documented code (Python/R), SQL queries, and data visualizations that tell a story. Focus on README files that explain the <i>why</i> behind your analysis.
Management & Leadership	Notion / LinkedIn / Portfolio Site	Case studies on organizational change, strategic plans, and evidence of project management methodologies (Agile, Lean) in action.
Healthcare Management	E-Portfolio / Professional Blog	Policy analysis papers, EHR optimization strategies, and reflections

Field of Study	Primary Platform	What to Showcase
		on healthcare ethics or informatics. Show you understand the intersection of care and technology.
Psychology & Social Services	Digital Dossier	Synthesized research summaries, community program designs, and evidence of specialized training or advocacy work.

Why Start Now?

- **Narrative Control:** A resume is a historical record; a portfolio is a future-facing narrative. It allows you to highlight the specific types of problems you *want* to solve next.
- **Searchability:** Recruiters active on LinkedIn and technical forums are more likely to find candidates with an indexed digital footprint.
- **Cognitive Augmentation:** Building a portfolio forces you to reflect on your learning. This metacognition makes you a more articulate candidate during interviews.

Immediate Steps

1. **Inventory Your Work:** Look back at your core graduate assignments. Which ones solved a real-world problem?
2. **Choose Your Medium:** Technical students should prioritize GitHub. Management and social science students should look toward Notion or a simple personal website.
3. **Focus on Documentation:** It is not just about the final product; it is about documenting the process, the challenges, and the results.

Your graduate work is too valuable to remain hidden behind a learning management system. Make your expertise visible.
